ADJUSTMENT FACTORS FOR STUDENTS OF AUSTRALIAN YEAR 12 PROGRAMS

Adjustment factors are automatically processed by the South Australian Tertiary Admissions Centre (SATAC) based on eligible subjects students passed in Year 12.

Universities Language, Literacy and Mathematics Scheme

All eligible students will be awarded 2 points, up to a total maximum of 4 points, for successfully completing a subject in any one of these categories:

- > 20 credits of a LOTE in the Languages Learning Area
- > 2ELS2O English Literary Studies or 2ESH2O English;
- > 2MHS2O Mathematical Methods or
- > 2MSC2O Specialist Mathematics.

Universities Equity Scheme

Students of certain specified schools in SA/NT will be awarded 5 bonus points. The list of eligible schools can be found on the SATAC website and is updated annually.

How CAN **I APPLY?**

AUSTRALIAN YEAR 12 PROGRAMS

You will need to apply through SATAC using UniWeb (satac.edu.au/undergraduate). Main round applications open in August and close in early December, however you may still apply through SATAC until early January as there are further offer rounds in January. As an international student you can apply for up to six degrees and if eligible, receive an offer from SATAC in the main offer round, which will be in December shortly after Year 12 results are released. Although you receive your offer from SATAC, you will need to accept and respond directly to the University as soon as possible.
